- 4. How can I enroll in the Academy? To enroll, fill out the electronic National Integrity Academy (NIA) Enrollment Form on the NIA page of the Integrity Center website. The Integrity Center's Academy enrollment form can be found at: http://integrity.naswa.org/form/nia-enrollment#no-back. Once the enrollment request is approved, the individual will be entered into the system and sent their login information.
- 5. Why does my supervisor need to approve my enrollment request? The Academy requires supervisory approval of each enrollment application so that supervisors and managers are aware of the time commitment and can then manage workload appropriately.
- 6. What do I do if I'm having problems getting into the website or eLearning courses? If you are having problems with courses or issues with the e-Learning modules, please contact the Academy at integrity@naswa.org.
- 7. How can I register for the Basic Fraud Investigations Instructor-led Training? You can reserve a seat on the Academy's website "Access Instructor-Led Training" area. Select the "Reserve My Seat" button for the location and date that you prefer, then click the "Register" button that appears and fill out the course registration form. - 8. Is there a fee? Funds for the production of the training have been provided by US DOL. As a result, there are no fees associated with attending the training other than travel costs to attend the Basic Fraud Investigations Instructor Led Training course. Stipends to assist with the costs of travel may be available. - 9. Can eLearning lessons/certificates be shown to a group of individuals, rather than every participant having to register individually? Yes, eLearning lessons can be shown to a group of individuals via a projector. However, the eLearning lessons are designed as self-paced lessons for individuals. It is more effective for people to take the lessons individually and then get together as a group to discuss. For the Operations Integrity certificate, the Academy has created meeting discussion guides for exactly this purpose. For example, operations staff would complete a module of five short lessons over the course of a week, and then discuss those lessons at a team meeting using the discussion guide. The discussion guide contains questions and activities that help a state customize the training to their needs.
- 10. Is it possible to incorporate one or two of the NIA's lessons into our regular training process for new hires? If so, how? Yes, the manager would need to register the new hires with the Academy. The Academy's Training Coordinator would then send out the learners' credentials, and the manager would tell them which lessons to take.

- 11. Is there anywhere else I can find comprehensive UI specific training? There is no other comprehensive UI specific training like the UI National Integrity Academy.
- **12. What training does the Academy offer?** The Academy offers training and certification programs in the areas of:
 - 1.) UI Program Leadership;
 - 2.) UI Operations Integrity;
 - 3.) UI Fraud Investigations;
 - 4.) UI Tax Integrity; and,
 - 5.) Data Analytics.

- 13. Which certificates are currently available? The UI Operations Integrity and UI Fraud Investigations certificates are complete and available now. Half of the UI Program Leadership certificate is available and more lessons are being built each day. Individual lessons in the UI Tax Integrity modules are available and more will be coming online soon. Data Analytics is currently in early development.
